Lead staff to realize the vision of using data to improve education for all students. Manage statewide functions relative to school/district accountability, data collection, research/analyses, and reporting. Develop staff through training and coaching to contribute to the new vision and priorities.

Led the implementation and redesign of Connecticut's school and district accountability model.

- Fully implemented the accountability system described in Connecticut's ESEA flexibility that included performance indices, school classifications, and a new performance report.
